Strengths: Your physical manifestation of anxiety through finger tapping effectively shows rather than tells her emotional state. The internal questions feel authentic to someone experiencing pre-presentation nerves.

Limited physical setting details → While you mention a "rusty table," your description of the physical space around Luna lacks specific details that would ground the reader more firmly in the scene. Consider expanding on the coffee shop environment to create a more complete picture.

Exemplar: *Her fingers tapped nervously against the small, rusty table tucked away in the shadowy corner where Luna always sat when needing to focus; each tap a gentle punctuation of her self-doubt. The bustling morning crowd and steamy windows created a barrier between her and the outside world, a temporary sanctuary where she could rehearse answers to her worst fears. What if they don't like it? What if they think I'm not enough?*

Unclear relationship dynamics → You introduce Sarah as "from the recruitment company" but don't clarify her relationship to Luna or the presentation. This leaves readers confused about whether Sarah is evaluating Luna, supporting her, or simply an acquaintance. Establishing their connection would strengthen the emotional impact of Sarah's encouragement.

It was Sarah from the recruitment company, the mentor who'd believed in Luna's potential from their first meeting six months ago. Standing at the counter with a portfolio tucked under her arm, a warm smile spread across her face. Sarah was everything Luna wasn't: open, outgoing, secure. But after coaching Luna through countless practice sessions, Sarah didn't seem to notice Luna's tight-lipped hesitation.*

■ Your piece shows promising emotional depth through Luna's anxiety and self-doubt. The sensory details in the coffee shop setting create a strong atmosphere, but the narrative would benefit from clearer stakes. What specifically makes this presentation so important to Luna? Adding concrete details about what she stands to gain or lose would help readers connect more deeply with her struggle. Also, the relationship between Luna and Sarah needs more development to make their interaction more meaningful. Try adding a brief flashback or memory that shows their history together. Your ending provides a nice moment of hope, but consider extending it slightly to show how Luna physically responds to this newfound confidence – perhaps through a change in posture or a deep breath. This would make her transformation more visible to readers.
