#2 "I would throw snowballs at anyone who passes on my territory, or even is close to my house!"

Tense inconsistency  $\rightarrow$  You switch between past tense "would throw" and present tense "passes" in the same sentence. This creates confusion about when the story is taking place. Choose either past or present tense and use it consistently throughout.

Strengths: You've created excitement with dialogue and the build-up to the snowball fight. The capital letters and multiple exclamation marks show enthusiasm and high energy.

Punctuation errors  $\rightarrow$  There are spacing issues after commas, and the sentence structure is awkward with the comma after "snowballs." This disrupts the flow of your dialogue and makes it harder to read smoothly.

Try adding a middle section that builds tension and a conclusion that resolves the conflict. Additionally, your dialogue needs more clarity about who is speaking. When Bob appears, it's confusing who says what. Try adding dialogue tags like "Xander shouted" or "Bob replied" to help your readers follow the conversation. Also, consider developing both characters more so readers understand why this snowball fight matters to them.
