Strengths:

- You've identified how the newsletter could benefit the school's reputation

What specific creative elements would be included? What types of imaginative content could students produce? Adding these details would help Mr Corr visualise your proposal better.

Exemplar: Secondly, a student-led newsletter would showcase our creativity and imagination through features like student artwork, creative writing pieces, puzzles designed by maths enthusiasts, and interviews conducted by our budding journalists. These expressions of ideas would not only improve students' confidence and skills but could also impress families considering our school for their children.

#3 I understand this initiative requires a lot of time and work. However, with proper guidance to manage content creation and publishing and with help of volunteer students, we can make it a success.

Strengths:

- You acknowledge potential challenges realistically
- You offer a solution to address the challenges

Weakness: Missing practical details → While you mention "proper guidance" and "volunteer students," you don't specify who would provide the guidance or how you would recruit volunteers. Adding concrete information about implementation would strengthen your proposal and show that you've thought through the logistics.

Exemplar: I understand this initiative requires time and work. However, with guidance from our English teachers who could supervise once a week during lunch breaks, and a team of volunteer students from each year level whom I've already spoken to about helping, we can share the workload and make this newsletter a success.

■ Your proposal shows enthusiasm and contains some good points about the benefits of a student newsletter. To make it more convincing, try adding specific details about how the newsletter would actually work. For example, you could mention what sections the newsletter might include, how often it would be published, and who would be responsible for different tasks. Additionally, consider explaining how you would ensure quality writing from young students, perhaps through teacher supervision or editing processes. Your arguments about skill development and showcasing achievements are strong, but could be strengthened with examples - perhaps mention specific school events that could be covered or types of student work that could be featured. Also, try to focus more on educational benefits rather than profit for the school, as this would likely be more persuasive to a teacher or principal. Lastly, you might want to include a short paragraph about how you personally would contribute to this newsletter project.
