**Strengths:** Your piece demonstrates genuine concern for marine wildlife and uses specific statistics to support your argument. The emotional connection you create helps readers understand the urgency of the problem.

**Weakness:** Unclear numerical expression  $\rightarrow$  The phrase "100,000 thousand" creates confusion about the actual number you're presenting. Additionally, the sentence structure makes it difficult to follow your reasoning clearly.

## Exemplar: One hundred thousand marine animals die every year from plastic entanglement, pushing many species closer to extinction.

**#2** "More than animals, humans accidentaly eat plastic because of it coming in fast foods. The volume of plastic entering our serene, tranquil oceans, lakes, and rives, is massive and needs to be fixed."

**Strengths:** Your piece attempts to connect the issue to human health, which strengthens your argument. You also paint a vivid picture of the environment being affected.

**Weakness:** Vague connection between ideas  $\rightarrow$  The link between fast food and plastic consumption isn't clearly explained, making your argument harder to follow. The sentence about water bodies also lacks specific detail about how plastic enters these environments.

#3 "Finally, significant portions of plastic waste, around 91%, ends up in landfills or the ocean."

**Strengths:** Your piece provides a concrete statistic that adds weight to your argument. The paragraph structure shows you're trying to organise your thoughts logically.

**Weakness:** Incomplete development of ideas  $\rightarrow$  This statistic appears suddenly without explanation of where it comes from or what it means for your argument. The paragraph doesn't build upon previous points effectively.

# Exemplar: Research shows that 91% of plastic waste ends up in landfills or oceans, demonstrating how our current disposal methods are failing to protect the environment.

Your piece shows strong passion for environmental protection, which is the foundation of effective persuasive writing. However, your arguments would benefit from clearer organisation and smoother connections between ideas. The opening paragraph raises important questions but jumps between different points without fully developing each one. Additionally, your second paragraph introduces several new concepts without clearly linking them to your main argument about banning plastic from canteens.

To improve the substance of your writing, focus on connecting each paragraph back to your main question about canteen plastic bans. Also, when you present statistics, explain what they mean and how they support your argument. Your conclusion would be stronger if it directly addressed the canteen ban question rather than making a general statement about plastic being a "monster." Consider organising your ideas so each paragraph focuses on one clear reason why canteens should ban plastic, making your argument easier to follow and more convincing.
