Section 1:

Strengths: Your vivid description of the QVB setting creates a strong visual image. The contrast between the bustling environment and the narrator's anxiety effectively establishes tension.

Vague imagery → Your description lacks specific sensory details that would make the scene more immersive. Rather than stating there were "countless people," you could describe specific types of people or their actions to create a more concrete picture.

The QVB bustled with morning commuters and tourists as I anxiously scanned the faces watching me. The sun had just begun to paint the horizon with blazes of orange, filtering through tall stained-glass windows and casting colourful patterns across the marble tiles.

Strengths: You effectively show the character's emotional journey from nervousness to growing confidence. The physical detail of sweaty palms adds authenticity to the character's anxiety.

Undeveloped transformation \rightarrow The shift from anxiety to confidence happens too quickly without showing the specific moments that triggered this change. You mention a "breathtaking melody" but don't describe what the character played or how the audience reacted.

The moment my fingers touched the ivory keys, Chopin's Nocturne flowed from my hands. My palms were still sweaty, a manifestation of my inadequacy, but as an elderly woman stopped to listen, then a young couple with their child, my racing heart began to steady with each note.

Strengths: You effectively tie the conclusion back to the character's motivation. The emotional payoff of seeing the money that will help the parents creates a satisfying resolution.

Limited emotional depth \rightarrow The ending focuses primarily on the money rather than the emotional impact of the performance itself. The narrator's feelings about discovering their own musical ability are mentioned but not explored fully.

After finishing my performance, I sat in wonder at how my fingers had remembered every note of such a complex piece. As commuters applauded and I counted nearly fifty dollars in my hat, tears welled in my eyes—not just for the money I could give my parents, but for discovering something in myself I never knew existed.

■ Your piece has a compelling premise with a clear beginning, middle and end. The character's motivation to help their unemployed parents gives the story emotional weight. However, you could strengthen your writing by adding more specific details about the music being played and the audience's reactions. For example, mention what song the character plays and show how specific audience members respond to the performance. Also, you could expand on the character's emotional journey by showing their thoughts during key moments. Try adding a short conversation with someone who appreciates the music or a specific memory that flashes through the character's mind while playing. Your story would benefit from stronger transitions between paragraphs to show how time passes during the performance. Additionally, consider developing the conclusion to balance both the financial success and the personal growth the character experiences through their performance.
