

## Section 1:

**#1 Have you ever thought about the people living in places were everywhere you look there's rubbish? This is why we have got a massive problem, countries like Bangladesh and India are facing trouble with getting rid of all the pollution that surrounds them. This causes water and air pollution. ## Strengths:

- You've effectively used rhetorical questions to engage your readers
- You've included specific examples of countries facing pollution problems

Weakness: Imprecise language and grammar → Your writing contains some grammatical errors that affect clarity. For instance, you've used "were" instead of "where" twice in this paragraph. The sentence "This causes water and air pollution" doesn't specify what "this" refers to clearly. Also, the verb "cause" should be "causes" to match the singular subject.

Exemplar: *Have you ever thought about the people living in places where everywhere you look there's rubbish? This widespread pollution is a massive problem, with countries like Bangladesh and India struggling to manage the waste that surrounds them.*

## Strengths:

- You've included a specific example (Aral Sea) and a relevant quote
- You've connected pollution to real-life consequences that readers can relate to

Weakness: Run-on sentences and structure → The first sentence runs on without proper punctuation. "That's not all what about Aral Sea..." needs commas or should be split into separate sentences. Several other sentences could benefit from better structure and punctuation. The paragraph jumps between different ideas without smooth transitions.

Exemplar: *That's not all. Consider the Aral Sea, which was once enormous in 1977 but has now shrunk to almost nothing. Pollution is one of the key reasons for this environmental disaster, creating severe environmental and health crises throughout the region.*

**#3 In order to help, we must find some ways, like: after eating fruits the peels leftover we could use it for compost using reusable bags, recycling plastic bottles paper and card board. These are some ways we can help. We could also switch to renewable sources like wind power or solar power instead of using fossil fuel.**

Strengths:

- You've offered practical solutions that readers can implement
- You've covered both waste management and energy sources as approaches to pollution

Weakness: Lack of detail in solutions → Your proposed solutions are mentioned but not developed with enough detail to be truly convincing. For example, when you mention composting fruit peels, you don't explain the environmental benefit. The sentence structure also makes it unclear whether "using reusable bags" is part of composting or a separate solution.

Exemplar: *In order to help, we must adopt several practical solutions. After eating fruits, we can use the leftover peels for composting, which reduces landfill waste and creates nutrient-rich soil. We should also make a habit of using reusable bags instead of plastic ones, and consistently recycle plastic bottles, paper and cardboard.*

■ Your piece shows passion for environmental issues, which comes through strongly in your rhetorical questions. You've made a good start by identifying key environmental problems like water pollution and the shrinking of the Aral Sea. To improve the depth of your writing, try developing each example more fully before moving to the next one. For instance, when you mention Bangladesh and India, you could add one more sentence explaining how pollution specifically affects people's daily lives there. Your call to action in the final paragraph is motivating, but it would be stronger if you connected it directly to your examples. Also, try organising your ideas into more distinct paragraphs—one focusing on water pollution, another on marine life, and a third on solutions. This would make your arguments flow more logically. Adding specific statistics about pollution reduction would strengthen your persuasive writing. Your piece would also benefit from clearer transitions between ideas to guide your reader through your argument.
