The more significant the rule she broke, the harsher the punishment would be.***

Strengths: You've created tension with the voice warning about consequences. The detail about "two singular slices of banana bread" adds a specific, interesting detail to the story.

Run-on sentences → Your sentences contain multiple ideas without proper punctuation or conjunctions. ***As she gathered her things to find out how to escape this trapped feeling, she heard a voice in her mind gradually becoming louder. It kept warning her about the serious consequences she would face if she continued. Despite this, Olivia set off on her journey, deliberately doing things that went against the rules.***

The ending feels rushed—consider showing some challenges they face while distributing the medicine. Adding more sensory details throughout would make readers feel more immersed in this world. Try describing how Olivia physically feels when the microchip is removed compared to before. Your story has great potential—with more attention to these details, it could become even more engaging.
