**Strengths:** Your piece creates immediate suspense with the mysterious rustle, and the physical description of Yoko's heart "thundering against his ribs" effectively shows his fear.

Weakness: Contradictory sensory details → The phrase "drowning out the deafening silence" doesn't make logical sense because silence cannot be deafening if it's being drowned out by a thundering heart. This creates confusion for readers trying to understand the scene.

Exemplar: His heart thundered against his ribs, the sound echoing in the oppressive silence.

**#2: Fire escape sequence** - "Heart thudding. Feet pounding. Hands feeling. Flames licking closer. Yoko continued to randomly dash around the walls."

**Strengths:** Your short, choppy sentences create urgency and panic, making readers feel Yoko's desperation.

**Weakness:** Unclear spatial description → The phrase "randomly dash around the walls" makes it difficult to picture what Yoko is actually doing. Readers need clearer action to follow the escape sequence properly.

Exemplar: Yoko frantically ran along each wall, pressing his palms against the surface searching for an exit.

**#3: Aunt's revelation -** "'Oh,' she said, looking surprised, 'You got out? Well then, I suppose you'll go the hard way.'"

**Strengths:** Your dialogue creates a shocking twist that completely changes how readers understand the story, and the aunt's casual tone contrasts brilliantly with the dangerous situation.

Weakness: Insufficient character motivation  $\rightarrow$  The aunt's actions and words suggest she deliberately trapped Yoko, but there's no explanation for why she would do this, leaving readers confused about her intentions.

Exemplar: 'You weren't supposed to escape so easily,' she said with a cold smile. 'Now we'll have to try something more challenging.'

■ Your piece shows strong instincts for building suspense and creating dramatic tension. The mystery element works well, and you've successfully made readers want to know what happens next. However, the story needs clearer explanations for key events. Additionally, some descriptions need to be more precise so readers can better visualise what's happening. Your dialogue effectively reveals character, but you could strengthen the story by giving clearer reasons for the aunt's behaviour. Also, work on making your action sequences easier to follow by describing movements more specifically. Furthermore, consider adding small details about the setting to help readers understand where Yoko is trapped. The ending suggests this might be some kind of test or punishment, but expanding on this would make the story more satisfying for readers.
