Section 1:

Strengths: Your piece captures Lilly's authentic emotions brilliantly, showing how children genuinely feel before new experiences. You've chosen relatable feelings like nervousness and excitement that readers can connect with easily.

Run-on sentences \rightarrow Your writing contains several sentences that run together without proper punctuation, making them difficult to follow. The opening "Lilly was packing her bag tomorrow was her big day it was her first sleepover" combines three separate thoughts that need clear separation. This pattern continues throughout, creating confusion for readers who struggle to identify where one idea ends and another begins.

Exemplar: "Lilly was packing her bag. Tomorrow was her big day—it was her first sleepover."

#2 "During the way there Lilly didn't talk she was looking at the Kookaburras, Cockatoos, Galahs singing happily she also saw the pesty mosquitoes chasing people."

Strengths: Your inclusion of native Australian birds adds wonderful local colour to your story. The contrast between the singing birds and pestering mosquitoes creates a vivid picture of the journey.

Fragmented description \rightarrow This section lacks clear sentence structure and proper connections between ideas. "During the way there" is awkward phrasing, and the entire description runs together without punctuation. The observations about wildlife feel disconnected from Lilly's emotional journey, missing opportunities to link her feelings with what she observes.

Exemplar: "During the drive, Lilly remained silent, watching kookaburras, cockatoos, and galahs singing cheerfully outside her window."

#3 "Hannah's room was filled with cats all over her room her night light, her pillowcase and her mat, her walls was Pastel Yellow with Bright Yellow stars."

Strengths: Your description creates a clear mental image of Hannah's bedroom theme. The specific details about cat decorations help readers visualise the space effectively.

Subject-verb disagreement → Your sentence contains grammatical errors that disrupt reading flow. "Her walls was" should be "her walls were" because "walls" is plural. Additionally, the

sentence structure is repetitive and choppy, with "her room" mentioned twice in close succession, creating unnecessary redundancy.

Exemplar: "Hannah's room was filled with cat decorations—her night light, pillowcase, and mat all featured cats, whilst her walls were pastel yellow with bright yellow stars."

■ Your piece demonstrates genuine understanding of childhood emotions and creates an engaging story about Lilly's first sleepover experience. You've captured the authentic nervousness and excitement children feel in new situations, which makes your writing relatable and engaging. Additionally, your use of Australian wildlife adds lovely local detail that brings the setting to life. However, your writing would benefit significantly from improved sentence structure and punctuation. Many sentences run together without proper breaks, making them challenging to read and understand. Also, some descriptions feel disconnected from the main emotional journey, missing opportunities to deepen the story's impact. To strengthen your writing, focus on writing complete sentences with proper full stops and commas. Furthermore, try connecting your descriptions more closely to Lilly's feelings—for example, how do the singing birds make her feel about her journey? Finally, read your work aloud to identify where natural pauses should occur, then add appropriate punctuation marks.
