Section 1:

#1 - Opening paragraphs (first two paragraphs) Strengths: Your opening creates immediate tension by showing Amelia's worry about Jessica's reaction, which draws readers in straight away. The setting details about the dance academy and barre help establish the context clearly.

Weakness: Unclear connection \rightarrow The plant metaphor with "its leaves dry, hunched towards the ground" appears suddenly without clear connection to the story. It feels out of place and confuses the reader about why you're describing a plant when the focus should be on Jessica's injury.

Exemplar: "But Amelia remained unconvinced, noticing how Jessica favoured her left foot when she thought no one was looking."

#2 - Middle section (paragraphs about the decision and hospital visit) Strengths: Your writing shows Amelia's difficult choice between friendship and doing the right thing, which creates good conflict. The hospital scene effectively shows how hurt Jessica feels through her accusation about wanting the lead role.

Weakness: Rushed dialogue → The conversation between Amelia and Jessica in the hospital feels too quick and doesn't give enough detail about their emotions. Jessica's angry response and Amelia's defence need more development to help readers understand their feelings better.

Exemplar: "Amelia took a deep breath before speaking. 'Jessica, I know you're angry with me, but I couldn't watch you hurt yourself anymore. Your ankle was getting worse each day, and I was scared you might never dance again if we didn't get help.'"

#3 - Ending section (reconciliation and plant reference) Strengths: Your resolution shows both characters growing and learning, with Jessica understanding Amelia's motives and suggesting they share the lead role. This creates a satisfying ending where friendship wins.

Weakness: Forced symbolism → The plant appearing again at the end with "leaves slowly unfurled, standing up straighter" feels pushed into the story without natural connection. Readers might not understand why the plant matters or how it relates to the friendship.

Exemplar: "In the weeks that followed, both girls discovered that sharing their challenges made them stronger dancers and better friends."

■ Your story tackles an important theme about friendship and making difficult choices, which many readers can relate to. The main conflict between loyalty and responsibility creates good tension throughout your piece. However, your writing would benefit from developing the emotional depth of your characters more fully. You could show more of what Amelia and Jessica are thinking and feeling during key moments, especially during their argument at the hospital. Additionally, the plant

metaphor needs clearer connection to your story's themes, or you might consider removing it entirely and focusing on the human relationships instead. Also, your dialogue could be expanded to sound more natural and show the characters' personalities better. The pacing moves quite quickly through important events, so slowing down during emotional scenes would help readers connect more deeply with your characters' experiences.
