#1 - Opening paragraph establishing setting and character emotion Strengths: Your atmospheric description creates a vivid airport terminal scene with sensory details like "thick with the scent of coffee and stale air" and "nervous energy humming in his bones." You effectively establish Leo's emotional state through physical descriptions like "clamminess of his palms" and the "heavy knot of anticipation."

Weakness: Unclear time progression → The paragraph jumps between different moments without clear transitions. You write "The crowds thinned as the last passengers...trickled out" then immediately "across the sea of faces, he saw her," which creates confusion about whether the crowds are thinning or if there's still a sea of faces.

Exemplar: The crowds gradually thinned as passengers departed, until finally, amongst the remaining faces, he spotted her familiar figure.

#2 - Initial dialogue and character interaction

Strengths: Your dialogue feels natural and captures the awkwardness of their reunion with Leo's observation about her hair. The mutual recognition of changes in each other shows the passage of time effectively.

Weakness: Missing emotional depth  $\rightarrow$  The conversation stays on surface-level observations about physical changes rather than addressing the seven-year separation. The phrase "Things definitely change" feels too casual for such a significant moment.

Exemplar: "So much has happened whilst we were apart. I've thought about this moment every single day."

#3 - Final reconciliation scene Strengths: Your conclusion provides emotional resolution with the metaphor of the knot untying and being replaced by "rushing warmth." The description of their embrace as a "silent conversation" effectively shows their reconnection.

Weakness: Rushed emotional transition → The shift from tentative conversation to complete forgiveness happens too quickly. The phrase "he was home" feels premature given they've barely reconnected after seven years apart.

Exemplar: Slowly, the familiar comfort of her presence began to ease the years of distance between them.

■ Your piece demonstrates strong descriptive writing skills and creates a touching reunion scene. The airport setting works well as a backdrop for their emotional meeting. However, you could strengthen the story by developing the characters' emotions more gradually. The seven-year separation deserves more exploration - perhaps showing Leo's specific memories or Clara's reasons for being away. Additionally, the dialogue could reveal more about their relationship and what caused their separation. Try expanding the middle section to show their conversation developing naturally from awkward small talk to deeper emotional connection. Also, consider showing Clara's perspective more - her nervousness and hopes for this reunion. Your writing shows good potential, and with more development of the emotional journey, this reunion scene could become even more powerful and believable.
