Section 1:

Strengths: Your opening creates a mysterious atmosphere and introduces Ivan's emotional state well through the "isolation bubble" image.

Weakness: Unclear imagery → The phrase "train door fills the station with gas" is confusing because train doors don't typically release gas. This makes it hard for readers to picture what's happening at the station.

Exemplar: As the train arrived with a hiss of brakes and steam, Ivan remained on the bench, waiting for an uncertain arrival.

#2 "A once smooth hand transformed into a gnarled fingertip that was placed gently on his shoulder. His head sagged down, yet his back stiffened, it was pretty much impossible to lift his head that piled with bricks on it."

Strengths: Your description of physical changes shows the passage of time effectively, and the "bricks on his head" helps readers understand Ivan's heavy feelings.

Weakness: Mixed body parts \rightarrow You describe "a once smooth hand transformed into a gnarled fingertip" which mixes hand and fingertip in a way that doesn't make sense. Also, the sentence structure is awkward with too many ideas joined together.

Exemplar: Her once smooth hands had become gnarled with age as she placed a gentle finger on his shoulder. His head sagged down whilst his back stiffened—it felt impossible to lift his head under the weight of his emotions.

#3 "Wrinkles smeared across Ivan's forehead, his eyes watery and red, 'And don't you remember how as a child, I had to sit on the street, starving until the foster home people found me?' he muttered as he casted a face full of guilt on his mother's face."

Strengths: Your dialogue reveals important backstory about Ivan's difficult childhood and creates emotional tension between the characters.

Weakness: Awkward word choices → "Wrinkles smeared" doesn't work because wrinkles appear, not smear. Also, "he casted a face full of guilt on his mother's face" is grammatically incorrect and unclear.

Exemplar: Wrinkles creased Ivan's forehead, his eyes watery and red. "And don't you remember how, as a child, I had to sit on the street, starving until the foster home workers found me?" he muttered, his words casting guilt across his mother's face.

■ Your piece tells an emotional story about a difficult reunion between Ivan and his mother, which is a compelling topic. The conflict between them feels real because you show both sides—the mother trying to justify leaving and Ivan expressing his pain. However, your writing would benefit from clearer descriptions that help readers picture exactly what's happening. Additionally, some sentences try to say too many things at once, making them hard to follow. Your dialogue works well to reveal the characters' emotions, but the sentences around it need smoother connections. Also, focus on using precise words that match what you're trying to describe—for example, wrinkles don't "smear" but rather "appear" or "crease." Furthermore, check that your metaphors make sense in the real world, like the train door releasing gas.
