Exemplar: "Respect is most important to me because I always try to treat everyone fairly in my conversations, whether they're my friends or people I've just met."

Also, consider explaining how your different interests connect to each other - for instance, how does reading help your writing, or how do the teamwork skills from netball apply to other areas of your life? Furthermore, you could strengthen your response by showing rather than just telling about your values through specific examples of times you've demonstrated persistence, respect, or integrity.
