Section 1

Weakness: Vague explanations → Your paragraph uses general phrases like "lots more" and "broaden the types they learn" without explaining specifically how reading different genres helps struggling students improve. You need to show the clear connection between genre variety and academic improvement.

Exemplar: "They can read different genres like fiction to improve their imagination and storytelling skills, non-fiction to learn new facts and information, and poetry to develop their understanding of language patterns."

#3 (Conclusion): "In conclusion, there should be a mandatory 30-minute reading session every day. It can help to enhance students' vocabulary, literacy, comprehension and writing. It can also support the students who are struggling to have a chance to catch up while improving strong ones."

Strengths: Your conclusion restates the main argument and summarises the key benefits you discussed. You remember to mention both struggling and strong students.

Weakness: Repetitive summary → Your conclusion simply repeats points from earlier paragraphs without adding new insights or showing why your argument matters for the future. A strong conclusion should leave readers thinking about the bigger picture.

Exemplar: "By implementing this daily reading time, schools can create a foundation for lifelong learning that will benefit students not just in their school years, but throughout their entire lives."

You've identified three solid reasons supporting mandatory reading time, which demonstrates good planning. However, your writing would benefit from deeper explanations and more specific examples. Instead of using general phrases like "lots more" or "many benefits," try to be more precise about exactly how reading helps students. Additionally, your paragraphs sometimes jump between ideas without smooth connections - using linking words like "specifically," "for instance," or "as a result" can help your ideas flow better. Also, consider adding more concrete examples or personal experiences to make your arguments more convincing. Your conclusion could be stronger by explaining why this topic matters for the future rather than just repeating your main points.

Implementing this will help improve academic skills, support students who are falling behind and strengthen their mental health.

To begin with, having a mandatory 30-minute reading time pushes students' academic levels higher. It will help them learn new vocabulary as they read books with challenging words, searching them up in a dictionary. Studies from the University of Sydney have shown that students who read books score higher in assessments than students who don't. Reading also improves their writing by encouraging deeper ideas and more complex vocabulary. Some argue that 30 minutes of reading is too short to make a difference. However, even a short time each day adds up, as every page contains something new that improves knowledge step by step. Therefore, it clearly improves academic performance.

#2 Furthermore, 30 minutes of reading helps students who are struggling to catch up with others. If everyone sticks to this habit every day, they will learn lots of new, interesting things [valuable information], teaching them lifelong lessons. Hence, it will help the students who are falling behind.

Lastly, 30 minutes of reading is mandatory for students because it will improve their mental health. It can reduce stress and anxiety, helping students refresh after long, tiring lessons or active breaks. It will also help students have peace and relax, regenerating minds after lots of thinking. School can be stressful, so a daily quiet reading session gives students time to calm down and release pressure. Consequently, by making this a mandatory session, schools can support students' wellbeing.
