#1 "One of humanity's greatest inventions, reading, alongside the point of it being relaxing many benefits have been proven from it."

Strengths: Your opening shows enthusiasm for reading and attempts to establish its importance to humanity. You also mention that benefits have been proven, which suggests you understand evidence matters.

Sentence Structure Confusion → This sentence tries to combine too many ideas at once, making it hard to follow. The phrase "alongside the point of it being relaxing many benefits" creates confusion because it's unclear how these parts connect. When you write "alongside the point of it being relaxing many benefits," readers can't tell what you're trying to say.

Exemplar: *Reading is one of humanity's greatest inventions and provides many proven benefits, including relaxation.*

#2 "A novel is the most idea expressing to some people, yet comics and picture books aren't afraid to be compared."

Strengths: You show understanding that different types of books appeal to different people. You also attempt to compare various forms of reading material.

Unclear Expression → The phrase "most idea expressing" doesn't make grammatical sense in English. Additionally, saying books "aren't afraid to be compared" gives human feelings to objects, which confuses your meaning. Your readers won't understand what point you're making about novels versus other book types.

Exemplar: *Novels offer the most detailed ideas for some readers, while comics and picture books provide equally valuable content in different formats.*

#3 "When reviewing these benefits, we start to notice how much of an impact reading has for our education. It now should be clear that everyday we must slot in a 30minute reading time for students."

Strengths: Your conclusion attempts to summarise the benefits discussed. You also make a clear recommendation about implementing reading time.

Weak Supporting Evidence → Your conclusion claims the benefits should be "clear" but your previous paragraphs don't provide strong enough evidence to support this claim. You mention benefits like stress relief and subject learning, but you don't explain how these specifically prove that 30 minutes is the right amount of time or why schools must implement this.

Exemplar: *These benefits demonstrate that regular reading time improves both learning and wellbeing, making a 30-minute daily reading period a worthwhile addition to school timetables.*

■ Your piece shows genuine passion for reading and recognises its educational value, which is a strong foundation. However, your writing would benefit from clearer organisation and stronger evidence to support your main argument. Currently, your ideas jump between different points without fully developing each one. For example, you mention that reading helps with stress and learning different subjects, but you don't explain how or why this happens. Additionally, you could strengthen your argument by providing more specific examples of how reading improves education. Also, your paragraphs would flow better if you used clearer topic sentences and connecting words between ideas. Furthermore, some of your sentences try to say too much at once, making them difficult to understand. Consider focusing on one main idea per sentence and ensuring each paragraph has a clear purpose that supports your overall argument about implementing 30-minute reading sessions.
