**#1: "Ice cream is the best dessert because it is beloved by all. Studies show that 83% of the world's population loves to eat ice cream."**

### Strengths:

- You've included a specific statistic to support your point, which makes your argument sound more convincing.
- Your opening statement is clear and tells readers exactly what you believe.

**Weak Supporting Evidence** → Whilst the statistic about 83% sounds impressive, your writing doesn't explain where this number comes from or how it connects to your main idea. When you say "everybody loves ice cream" right after giving a percentage that isn't 100%, it creates confusion. The phrase "because who doesn't?" assumes all readers agree with you, but this doesn't actually prove your point. Your argument would be stronger if you explained what makes ice cream special rather than just saying everyone likes it.

**Exemplar:** *Research shows that ice cream remains one of the most popular desserts globally, with its creamy texture and variety of flavours appealing to people across different cultures and age groups.*

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**#2: "Ice cream is just like a haven; it's peaceful when you eat it, ice cream is comforting in times of sadness, and ice cream is a yummy snack to have weekly."**

### Strengths:

- You've used a comparison (haven) to help readers understand how ice cream makes people feel.
- You've listed multiple reasons why people enjoy ice cream, which adds detail to your argument.

**Run-on Sentence Structure** → This sentence tries to say too many things at once without proper punctuation to separate the ideas. The semicolon connects "haven" to "peaceful," but then you list more ideas with commas that should be separated differently. The word "yummy" is quite informal and doesn't match the more serious tone you started with when using "haven." Your ideas about comfort

and enjoyment are good, but they get jumbled together, making it harder for readers to follow each point clearly.

**Exemplar:** *Ice cream provides comfort like a peaceful haven. When you eat it, the smooth texture and sweet taste can lift your spirits during difficult times, making it a perfect treat to enjoy regularly.*

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**#3:** "Did you know that ice cream was made back in the 1700s, China? This not only shows that ice cream has been with us for more than 300 years, but it also has a strong past, is living in the present, and will be greater in the future."

**Strengths:**

- You've included historical information to show ice cream's importance over time.
- You've tried to connect the past to the present and future, which shows bigger-picture thinking.

**Vague Historical Connection** → Your sentence about ice cream being "made back in the 1700s, China" has grammar issues and lacks detail about what this history actually means for your argument. Saying ice cream "has a strong past, is living in the present, and will be greater in the future" uses broad phrases that don't explain anything specific. What does "strong past" mean? How does knowing ice cream is old prove it's the best dessert? Your writing would improve if you explained how ice cream's long history actually supports your main point about it being the best dessert.

**Exemplar:** *Ice cream has a fascinating history dating back centuries, with recipes evolving from simple frozen treats to the countless varieties we enjoy today. This long tradition demonstrates how ice cream has continuously adapted to different tastes and preferences across generations.*

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■ Your piece presents an enthusiastic argument about ice cream, and your passion for the topic comes through clearly. However, your writing would benefit from developing deeper reasons that explain *why* ice cream deserves the title of "best dessert." Right now, you rely heavily on saying that everyone loves it, but this doesn't give readers new information or help them understand what makes ice cream unique. Your paragraph about ice cream being "easier to make, more cost-efficient, and can be easily mass-produced" appears at the very end but never gets explained—these points could actually be strong

reasons if you developed them with examples and details. Additionally, some of your sentences try to cover too many ideas at once, which makes them difficult to follow. Try focusing each sentence on one clear idea, then use the next sentence to add more detail or move to a new point. Your argument about gluten-free options feels disconnected from your main points, and the phrase "but what else can we do?" doesn't actually address concerns about ice cream being cold. Also, consider organising your ideas so that similar points stay together—for instance, all the reasons about taste and comfort could form one section, whilst practical benefits like cost and production could form another. Your writing shows good enthusiasm, but strengthening your explanations and improving your sentence structure will help readers understand and agree with your viewpoint more easily.
