

## Section 1

### #1: Opening Paragraph (First paragraph beginning with "Good morning everyone...")

#### Strengths:

- Your opening creates a vivid sensory picture that helps readers imagine the experience of eating pizza through details like the "irresistible aroma" and "crispy" crust
- The hook effectively grabs attention by asking readers to use their imagination, which draws them into your speech immediately

**Vague Conclusion** → Your final sentence states "Pizza is not just food, but is a heavenly experience," but you haven't yet told your readers what main points you'll be discussing. A persuasive speech works best when readers know early on what arguments you'll be making. Instead of just saying pizza is heavenly, you could mention that you'll be discussing its variety, its social benefits, and its worldwide popularity.

**Exemplar:** *Pizza is not just food, but a delicious choice that offers endless variety, brings people together, and is loved around the world.*

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### #2: Statistics Paragraph (Paragraph beginning with "Did you know that over 5 billion pizzas...")

#### Strengths:

- Including specific numbers (5 billion pizzas, over half eaten by US citizens) adds credibility to your argument and shows you've thought about evidence
- You connect the statistics back to your main idea by explaining what this proves about pizza's popularity

**Unsupported Claim** → You write "This is proof of how popular pizza is globally and how much it is being enjoyed by everyone," but consuming lots of pizza doesn't automatically mean it "spreads happiness and connection." People might eat pizza simply because it's convenient or cheap. You need to

explain more clearly how eating pizza actually creates these positive feelings rather than just assuming the connection exists.

**Exemplar:** *These numbers show that pizza is enjoyed globally because it brings people together for celebrations, parties, and family dinners, creating opportunities for happiness and connection.*

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### #3: Social Connection Paragraph (Paragraph beginning with "Pizza is not just about flavour...")

#### Strengths:

- Your specific example of Criniti's and their metre-long pizzas gives concrete proof of how pizza encourages sharing
- The phrase "not just a meal, but an experience of sharing food and laughter together" effectively shows the deeper meaning of pizza beyond just eating

**Limited Development** → Whilst you mention that pizza connects friends and family, you only provide one example (Criniti's). Your paragraph would be stronger if you explored different ways pizza creates connection. For instance, you could discuss pizza parties for birthdays, families making pizza together at home, or how sharing different slices lets everyone try new flavours together.

**Exemplar:** *Pizza brings people together in many ways: families can customise their own pizzas at home, birthday parties often centre around pizza boxes spread across tables, and sharing different slices means everyone gets to taste something new whilst spending time together.*

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■ Your persuasive speech shows good effort in using descriptive language and organising your ideas into clear paragraphs. You've chosen a topic you're clearly enthusiastic about, which comes through in your writing. However, your piece would benefit from deeper thinking about your arguments. Right now, you state that pizza is wonderful and give some reasons, but you don't fully explain why these reasons matter or connect them strongly to your main point.

To strengthen your content, think about each paragraph as needing to answer "so what?" For example, you mention many toppings exist, but you could expand on why variety is important—perhaps it means nobody feels left out, or it encourages people to try new things. Additionally, your conclusion

repeats your introduction without adding new insights. Instead of just restating that pizza is great, you could remind readers of your three strongest points and end with a powerful final thought about why pizza deserves to be their top choice.

Your paragraphs sometimes jump from one idea to another without smooth connections. Try using linking words at the start of paragraphs to show how each point builds on the previous one. Also, some of your sentences could be combined or split to create better flow. Working on these transitions will help your speech feel more polished and easier to follow. Remember, strong persuasive writing doesn't just tell readers what to think—it convinces them through clear reasoning and well-developed examples.
