Strengths:

- Your opening grabs attention by using a real moment from your life that readers can relate to
- You clearly show the speed difference between struggling alone and getting help from ChatGPT

Vague Connection: → Your anecdote stops too quickly and doesn't connect smoothly to the rest of your article. After mentioning the maths problem, you jump straight to asking "how many people must be using this" without explaining what you learnt from that experience or why it matters. Your readers need to understand why this moment was important enough to start your whole article. Try adding one or two sentences explaining how this experience changed your view of technology or made you curious about ChatGPT's impact on others.

Exemplar: *Last year I was staring at a maths problem for 10 minutes that I got as homework from school. I decided to open ChatGPT and it gave me a simple solution within seconds of me asking it. That moment made me realise how much this tool had changed the way I learn, and I wondered whether other students felt the same way.*

#2: "ChatGPT is a chatbot made by OpenAI in 2022 and it can do almost anything from answering simple questions to creating full on websites. It is also one of the strongest technological thing in the world right now."

Strengths:

- You provide important background information about when ChatGPT was created and who made it
- You give examples of different tasks ChatGPT can do, which helps readers understand its range

Missing Depth: → Your explanation stays on the surface and doesn't help readers truly understand what makes ChatGPT special. Saying it's "one of the strongest technological thing in the world right now" is very general and doesn't tell us anything specific. What does "strongest" mean? Is it the number of users? The types of tasks it can do? How it learns? Your readers need concrete details to understand why ChatGPT matters. Instead of listing what it can do, explain how it does these things differently from older technology or why people find it so useful.

Exemplar: *ChatGPT is a chatbot made by OpenAI in 2022 that has changed how millions of people work and learn. Unlike older computer programmes that could only follow strict rules, ChatGPT can understand natural human language and respond in ways that feel like a real conversation.*

#3: "ChatGPT makes daily life super easy. Students use it for homework and writers use it for ideas and teachers for making lessons. It saves time and help people learn faster."

Strengths:

- You show different groups of people who benefit from ChatGPT
- You identify a clear advantage (saving time)

Undeveloped Examples: → Your examples are rushed and don't show your readers exactly how ChatGPT helps each group. Saying "students use it for homework" could mean copying answers, getting explanations, or checking work—these are very different uses! Similarly, "writers use it for ideas" doesn't explain whether it helps them brainstorm, overcome writer's block, or organise their thoughts. Your article needs specific examples that paint a picture. For instance, you could describe a student using ChatGPT to understand a difficult science concept by asking follow-up questions, or a teacher using it to create a quiz in five minutes instead of an hour.

Exemplar: *Students use ChatGPT to break down complicated topics, like asking it to explain photosynthesis step by step when their textbook feels confusing. Writers turn to it when they're stuck, using it to brainstorm different story endings or find better ways to describe a character.*

■ Your piece tackles an interesting topic and shows that you've thought about both positive and negative sides of ChatGPT. However, your writing needs more depth throughout. Many of your paragraphs mention ideas without fully exploring them, which leaves your readers wanting more information. For example, when you write about AI, you say "it is like you ask it something and it gives

you answer," but this explanation is too simple for such an important concept. Your readers need to understand what makes AI different from a regular search engine or calculator.

Additionally, your structure needs strengthening. Your second paragraph tries to cover too many topics at once—it jumps from explaining ChatGPT to defining AI to discussing pictures and apps to mentioning problems with humans. Each of these ideas deserves its own space to grow. Consider breaking this long paragraph into smaller ones, with each focusing on one main idea. Your third paragraph about daily life would benefit from expanding those quick examples into fuller descriptions that show exactly how people use ChatGPT in their real lives.

Also, your conclusion feels rushed. You've only written three sentences when you could use this space to tie your opening story back to your main points or suggest what readers should think about when using ChatGPT themselves. Think about adding a sentence that connects back to your maths homework moment—perhaps explaining how your own use has changed since that first time, or what you've learnt about using it wisely.
