#### Strengths:

- You've clearly stated your main idea right at the beginning, which helps your reader understand what your writing will be about
- Your balanced approach of showing both positive and negative sides demonstrates fair thinking

Lack of Development → This opening sentence introduces an interesting idea about curiosity and discovery, but your writing doesn't actually explore these concepts deeply. Instead of explaining how the internet "limits real discovery" or "sparks curiosity," you shift to listing general goods and bads. Your piece would be stronger if you explained what you mean by "real discovery" and gave specific examples of how technology affects curiosity.

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#2: "Like doom scrolling on apps like TikTok or Youtube shorts. You also could might go to inappropriate platforms which is also a bad thing."

#### Strengths:

- You've identified a real problem that affects many young people today
- Using specific app names (TikTok, YouTube shorts) makes your point relatable

**Incomplete Sentence Structure** → Your first sentence here begins with "Like," which makes it a fragment rather than a complete sentence. Additionally, the phrase "You also could might go" combines two helping verbs incorrectly. Your explanation of why inappropriate platforms are bad is too vague—simply saying it's "a bad thing" doesn't help your reader understand the actual problems or consequences.

Exemplar: "Endless scrolling on apps such as TikTok or YouTube Shorts can become addictive and waste valuable time. You might also accidentally encounter inappropriate content that

### isn't suitable for your age group."

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#3: "So, what are the dos and don'ts about the internet? Well, the good things about the internet is the creativity and entertainment. Which expands you're imagination."

#### Strengths:

- Using a question to re-engage your reader is an effective technique
- You're attempting to summarise your main points

Subject-Verb Disagreement and Repetition → The phrase "the good things...is" contains a grammar error—plural subjects need plural verbs. Your sentence "Which expands you're imagination" is a fragment because it can't stand alone. More importantly, this conclusion largely repeats information you've already mentioned earlier without adding new insights or bringing your ideas together in a meaningful way. Your ending would be stronger if it reflected on the title's question about imagination fading away.

Exemplar: "The good things about the internet are the opportunities for creativity and entertainment, which expand your imagination and help you learn new skills."

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■ Your writing tackles an important question about technology and imagination, but it needs more focus and depth. At the moment, your piece feels like two different essays—one about imagination (mentioned in your title) and another listing general pros and cons of the internet. To strengthen your work, return to your opening question and make sure each paragraph connects back to imagination specifically.

Your second paragraph would benefit from explaining *how* apps like Canva and Minecraft actually develop imagination, rather than just naming them. Additionally, your fourth paragraph introduces health effects (headaches, eye strain, sleep disruption) which seem disconnected from your main question about imagination. Consider whether these details truly support your argument or if you should replace them with points about how excessive screen time might affect creative thinking instead.

Your writing also needs clearer paragraph structure. Several of your paragraphs try to cover too many different ideas at once. For instance, your final paragraph jumps between creativity, inappropriate content, cyberbullying, privacy issues, harmful content, anxiety, depression, and addiction—all in just a few sentences. Each of these topics deserves its own focused explanation. Try developing one main idea per paragraph with specific examples and clear reasoning.

To improve your piece, choose whether you're answering "Is imagination fading?" or "What are the pros and cons of technology?" Then, reorganise your paragraphs so each one develops a clear point that

supports your answer. Your conclusion should directly respond to your title question rather than simply repeating earlier information.
