#1 "The social media ban plays a crucial role in protecting young children from viewing harmful content online, that may affect their mental health and wellbeing."

Strengths:

- Your opening sentence clearly states your main argument about why the ban is important
- You identify mental health and wellbeing as key concerns, which are relevant to your topic

Unnecessary Comma → The comma after "online" creates a break in your sentence that shouldn't be there. When you write "that may affect their mental health," the word "that" connects directly to "content" without needing a pause. This makes your sentence flow less smoothly and interrupts the reader's understanding.

Exemplar: *The social media ban plays a crucial role in protecting young children from viewing harmful content online that may affect their mental health and wellbeing.*

#2 "Firstly, it is important to know if a young child is experiencing cyberbullying as it can damage their self esteem as well as their mental health. Cyberbullying can influence an adolescents mind as well."

Strengths:

- You use "Firstly" to show you're starting your first main point, which helps organise your ideas
- You explain why cyberbullying matters by connecting it to self-esteem and mental health

Missing Punctuation and Repetitive Phrasing → The term "self esteem" needs a hyphen to be written correctly as "self-esteem." Additionally, "adolescents" requires an apostrophe to show possession when you mean "an adolescent's mind." Your second sentence repeats the same idea as your first sentence by saying cyberbullying affects young people's minds, which doesn't add new information to support your argument.

Exemplar: *Firstly, it is important to recognise when a young child is experiencing cyberbullying, as it can damage their self-esteem and mental health. This form of online harassment can lead to lasting psychological harm that affects young people well into adulthood.*

#3 "For example, one might watch a video about false information that is very inappropriate and not suitable for their age restrictions, which leads to them feeling a sensation of anxiety with a touch of mental illness."

Strengths:

- You attempt to provide a specific example to support your point about inappropriate content

Unclear and Imprecise Language → The phrase "a touch of mental illness" doesn't make sense because mental illness isn't something that comes in small amounts like a "touch" of something. Mental health conditions are serious and specific, not vague sensations. Your sentence also uses too many words to express a simple idea—phrases like "a sensation of anxiety with a touch of mental illness" are

confusing and unclear. Instead of explaining exactly what harm the inappropriate content causes, you've created a muddled description that weakens your argument.

Exemplar: *For example, a child might watch a video containing false or disturbing information that is unsuitable for their age, which could lead to anxiety, nightmares, or other mental health difficulties.*

■ Your piece presents a clear position on the social media ban, but your arguments need more specific evidence and clearer explanations. Instead of saying cyberbullying "creates an atmosphere of gloom and despair," explain exactly how it happens and what research shows. Additionally, your second body paragraph needs more development—you mention inappropriate content causing nightmares but don't explain why the ban specifically would prevent this better than other solutions. Also, strengthen your conclusion by doing more than just restating your position; summarise your strongest points about why the ban works better than alternatives like parental controls or education programmes.
